Fact 22: Who invented the Telephone? Alexander Graham Bell also continued his work with the deaf and established the American Association to Promote Teaching of Speech to the Deaf in 1890.

Fact 23: Who invented the Telephone? In January 1915 Alexander Graham Bell made the first transcontinental phone call from New York speaking to Thomas Watson in San Francisco.

Fact 24: Who invented the Telephone? Alexander Graham Bell died on August 2, 1922 at Baddeck, Nova Scotia, Canada. He will forever be remembered as the inventor of the telephone. It was nearly 100 years after the invention of the telephone that Martin Cooper invented the Cell Phone in 1973. The Smartphone was invented in 1992 at IBM.




